The Players Blitz

The Players Blitz will be on Saturday, May 14. The entry fee is \$30, which \$12 is for the blitz and \$18 is for carryover skins game. The skins is optional, but you must get in to be eligible for The Beltone Cup. The format is your blitz points added to a pro playing in the third round of The Players. The left over money in the skins game will be added to the Beltone Cup prize fund. This will be done for US Open, Open and PGA. Points will be awarded based on finish in these events with the winner winning the Beltone Cup and the prize fund.

Memorial Day Blitz

The Memorial Day Blitz will be on May 30th. The entry fee is \$30, which \$12 is for the blitz and \$18 is for carryover skins game. It is open to anyone and anytime, but you must play with someone else that is playing. Each Hole is worth \$1 from everyone. Wherever the last skin is, you get your money back. Let's say there is 20 people playing and you win the only skin on #10, you would win \$10 from all 20 people (\$200) and then everyone gets \$8 back. Should be a lot of fun, so DON'T MISS OUT!

On the Course with Doyle

The tail end of April finally brought us some warmer nighttime temperatures to help stimulate Bermuda grass growth. The fairways finally started to respond to increased fertility. Since the fairways have been the topic of discussion all month let me clarify the situation for everyone. The main difference between this year and the years prior is the overseed. We would typically have overseed in the fairways from November through May and sometimes even into June some years depending on temperature. The decline in the Bermuda grass is not visible due to the overseed but I have observed this for years. First of all we are dealing with 45 year old turf that does not respond well to cooler temperatures and a decreased amount of sunlight. This decline I have personally witnessed for years. This is why the decision was made to overseed fairways. However this decision is not without consequences. This repetitive cycle has shortened our Bermuda grass growing season for many years therefore limiting the plants ability to obtain an adequate root system to help with its recovery. Most summers are spent trying to recover top growth mainly. Not to mention that the Ryegrass robs elements from fertilizer applications made during the early part of the year. This year will be drastically different by providing us with at least one more full month of adequate growing conditions therefore creating a healthier plant going into fall. At this point, even though they may appear thin, we have more Bermuda grass on the fairways than we ever have in the past 12 years. They are responding well to the increased fertility and aerification. We will continue to aerate fairways throughout the month until they are entirely healed. Another problem that influences spring recovery is cart traffic. We do not ask for everyone to limit the cart traffic in fairways without good reasons. The increased traffic throughout the winter months adversely affects the Bermuda grass because it simply cannot recover from the stress and it also compounds the compaction problem which we are limited in our ability to correct. Your cooperation can be crucial in the spring recovery process.

Finally, I would like to commend our Ladies Association for always following the cart rules and also setting a good example in general. Thank you ladies.

We need all the help that we can get in this matter. Thank you.

Always remember to make a tee time if you plan on playing golf. Don't assume because you play every Thursday at 8:45, that you will be able to play. So help us out and remember to book that tee time. Always remember to start on hole #1, groups of more than 4 need to be approved and please let faster groups play through.

Please help Doyle out by KEEPING THE CARTS OFF THE FAIRWAYS as much as possible! Please keep the carts off the green and tee slopes as much as possible. Golf cart traffic causes more damage than anything else on a golf course. Please fix the ball marks on the greens, yours and others, and please fill in all the divots with sand. This is a very important time for the golf course and we need your help! We thank you for your cooperation.
